# Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!

## RECEPTION

In Maths, we have been learning about Number Bonds. This week we have had fun outdoors, using hula hoops as our two 'parts' to group items. We have also used the part-whole model to share sweets. We showed lots of focus during this activity and were excited to eat our delicious counters.



## YEAR 2

After having read "Clever Polly and the Stupid Wolf", we used our knowledge of forces to sculpt a wolf to change the shape of the clay. We twisted, bent, stretched, squashed and rolled to create a model of what we believed the wolf would look like! We then thought about what kind of forces we had used for each part of the wolf - pushes or pulls.



In Art, we have made Silver Birch winter trees, trying to show shade and shadow on the frosty moonlit trees.





In our RE lessons this week, Year 4 have been learning about the local church and the importance of the role of the community. As a homework task, the children were asked to find out about a local group in their area that supports the community in some way. The children then shared their findings with the class and it was lovely to hear about the brilliant work of so many groups such as Age UK Tunbridge Wells, Mayfacs, Rotherfield St Martin and many more.


Also this week, we have been learning about 'States of Matter' in Science. We thought about what can be categorised as a solid, liquid or gas and then had lots of fun making a substance called 'oobleck' which is quite strange and both a liquid and a solid!



Children in Year 6 have been studying 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes. They have enjoyed making an interactive PowerPoint glossary of the archaic language they have discovered in the poem. As well as that, they have been gradually learning the poem to recite it off-by-heart, using actions as cues. Having discussed and unpicked the poem further, they have written diaries in role as Tim the ostler and letters from Bess to suggest and alternative ending to the story. Next week, they will be writing newspaper reports about the dramatic ending!

In Art, they have been drawing ribbons (which feature in the poem) to practise proportion and size as well as adding shade. They have then started to experiment with pen and ink.





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
