Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!

NURSERY: Some of the many activities Nursery have been doing over the last week including making apple crumble, exploring different textures and drawing around ourselves on the playground.



YEAR 1: In Science, for the topic 'Ourselves', the children have been busy labelling parts of the body for which one of the children kindly modelled. They thoroughly enjoyed the challenge of making the most smelly sock, using different kinds of herbs and some other secret ingredients.



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YEAR 3: The children in Year 3 have made a super start to the new school year and have been working so hard! One of the things they have enjoyed the most over the last 3 weeks is beginning to learn to code. They have been using a program called Scratch. It allows the children to use block based, visual programming to create projects. They have learnt how to select characters and backgrounds and write script to control the movement and actions of these on screen. They have really enjoyed doing this and have becoming amazingly adept at it very quickly!



YEAR 5: Year 5 have been very busy so far this term. They have been reading stories from Rudyard Kipling's "Jungle Book" and revising the rules of punctuation for direct speech. They have also been investigating poetry and language features used in poems. In Maths, they have been rounding numbers up to 100,000, placing whole numbers and decimals accurately on numbers lines and multiplying and dividing decimal numbers by 10 and 100.

In R.E. they have been thinking about qualities, which are aspects of their personality, and skills that children have acquired. In class they cut out stars and they wrote their own qualities and talents on each of the points of the star. They thought about how they are unique and how they can try to develop different qualities that they do not find so easy.

In ICT they have been enjoying learning to program in Kodu. They have learnt how to program Kodu and also how to add terrain and program new characters. Many children also downloaded the program at home to improve and build on their skills.
