FOUNDATION STAGE

This week the Foundation Stage enjoyed their trip to Wakehurst Place. They took part in a Dragon treasure trail finding seeds, a seed workshop and finally they made sunflowers from natural resources.

YEAR 3



Our Science topic for this term is Animals, including Humans. As part of our topic, we conducted an investigation to see whether people with longer femurs can jump further. We began by measuring our femurs. We then went out to the MUGA where we performed a standing jump which was carefully measured by another member of our group. We found that there was not a link between femur length and length of jump. In fact, some of the shorter members of our class jumped a really long way!






YEAR 5


One of the Science topics that Year 5 have begun to study this term is 'Materials and their Properties'. They have begun by looking at what the term 'property' means, the different scientific vocabulary that we can use to describe materials and why we use certain materials for different purposes. The children have illustrated some of the scientific vocabulary for our Science display:



In History, we have begun a topic on The Indus Valley Civilisation. The children have discovered where the Indus Valley was located in the World and completed map work to see that the civilisation grew around the Indus River in what is now modern-day Pakistan and North West India.



They have also been researching how and when historians and archaeologists actually discovered the Indus Valley Civilisation and when it existed. Lovely work, Year 5!
