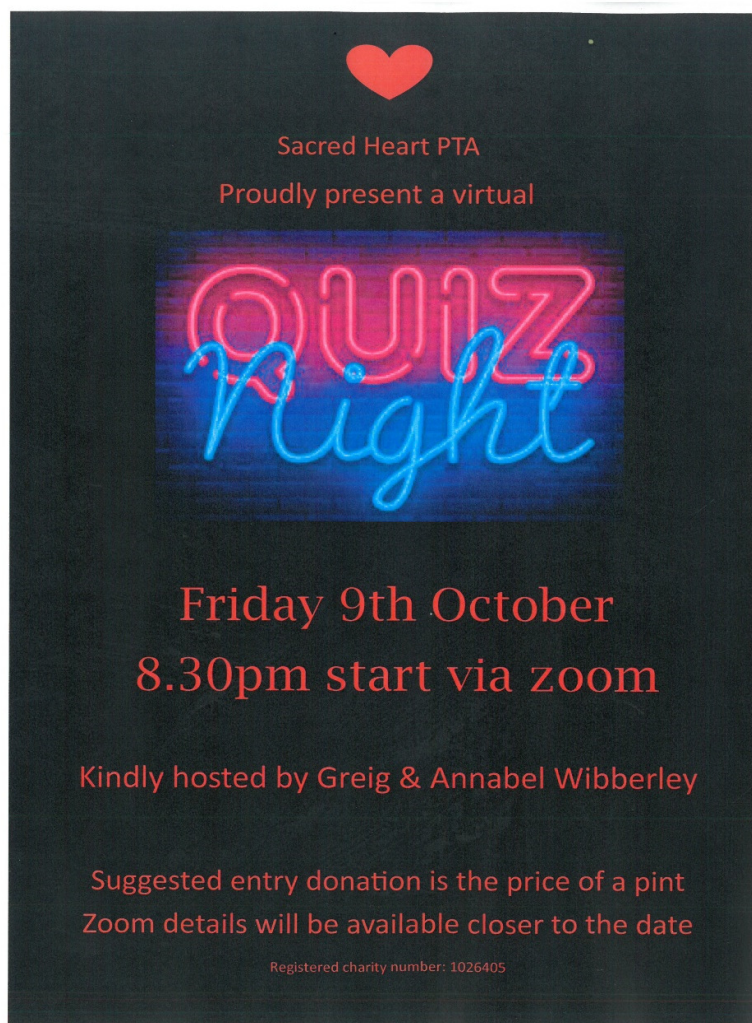
FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

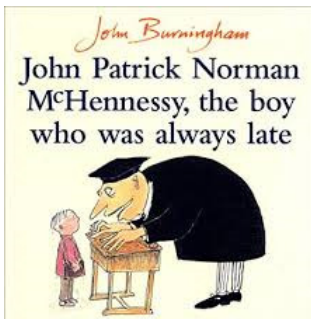
Year 2

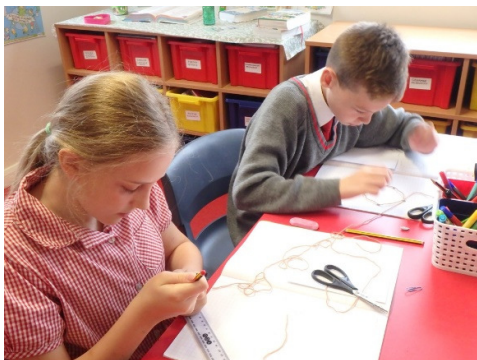
