YEAR 1

Children in Year 1 have been enjoying the story of 'Lucy's Picture' and have had great fun making their own 'feely pictures'. Just like Lucy, it was great dipping into the boxes with a great variety of materials and thinking about what they looked and felt like. We then described our picture using plenty of adjectives. This all links in with our lessons about Materials in Science and the use of descriptive language in our English lessons.



In RE we have been reading St Luke's Gospel, the stories of the Presentation of Jesus and Finding Jesus in the temple. We acted out, did hot seating and freeze framing to remember the important parts of the stories. We like Luke's Gospel as he keeps on reminding us that Jesus came for everyone.







In Maths we have been learning about Place Value using lots of different resources such as arrow cards and base ten equipment to represent the value of the digits in 2-digit numbers.

YEAR 4

Children in Year 4 have created their own artwork inspired by Paul Klee's *The Golden Fish*. They have been exploring his use of colour and experimenting with various techniques using oil pastels. They then focused on the sgraffito technique, layering contrasting warm and cool colours. The children carefully scratched out intricate patterns and imaginative shapes, capturing the essence of Paul Klee's unique style. We are looking forward to displaying this for our Musical 'Pirates Versus Mermaids' later this term.
