At bedtime Olivia got into bed and saw me there. She looked a bit cross so I gave her a lick on the face to make her happy again!

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
In Year 3 it has been another busy week! We have been working on the legend of King Arthur and the Sword, comparing film with written versions and



The children then read 'Caged Bird' by Maya Angelou and thought about what it would be like to be a caged rather than a free bird. They read an author profile of




Maya Angelou and evaluated poetry performances and prepared for their own poetry performance.

At school, I use this message with the younger children to show them how to do this more often and so they can do the same to others.


If people around me do the same, then the world will be much better place and more positive and hopefully this message will spread.
