YOUNG INVENTOR

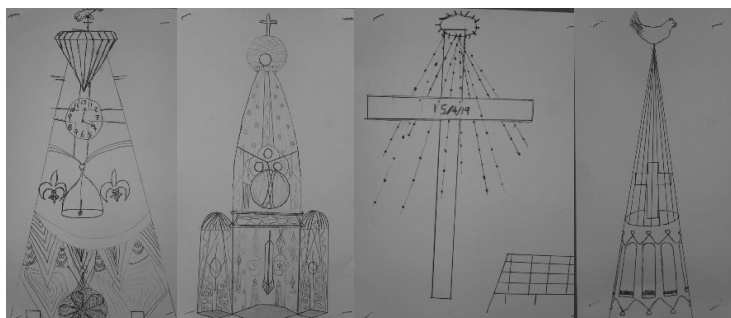

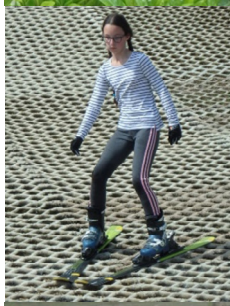
