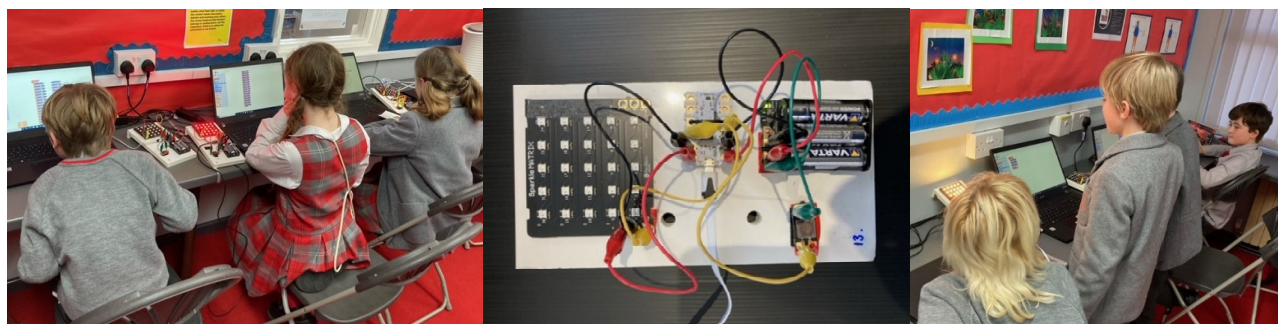

RECEPTION

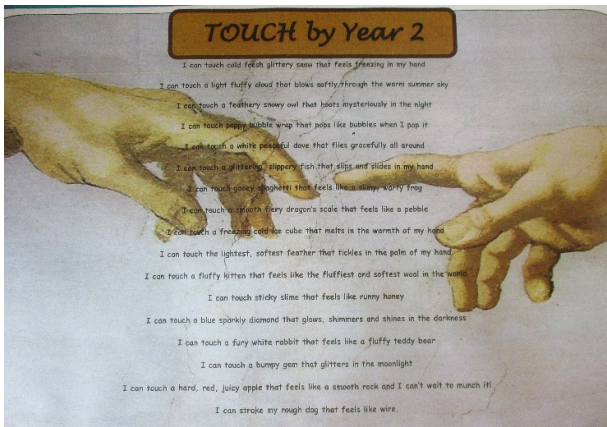

I can touch cold fresh glittery snow that feels freezing in my hand.

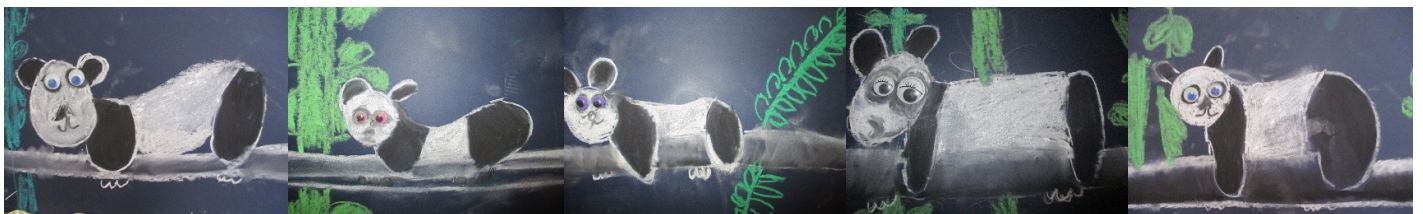
I can touch a light fluffy cloud that blows softly through the warm summer sky.

I can touch a feathery snowy owl that hoots mysteriously in the night.

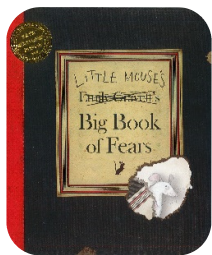
I can touch the lightest softest feather that tickles in the palm of my hand.

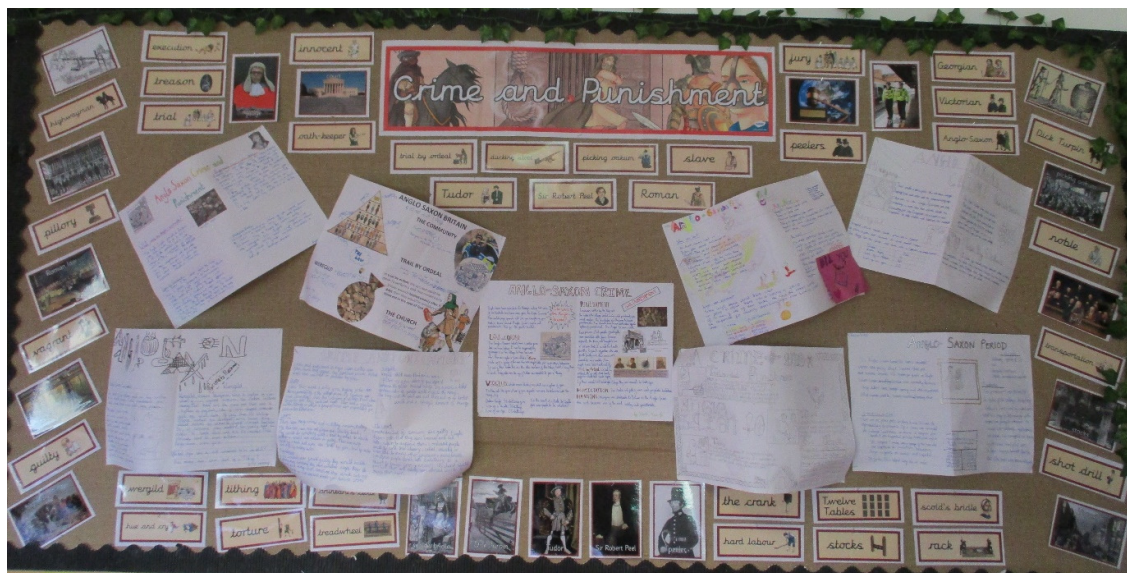
YEAR 4
