### NURSERY

We have had a fabulous week in Nursery. The children have all been excited to see their friends and share their half term news.

Our theme for this week is "Into the Woods" and children have been learning all about woodland animals such as badgers, hedgehogs, rabbits, foxes, deer, owls, mice and squirrels. We have talked about their habitats and most importantly what they like to eat!



The children have made some animal tracks using paint and practised their phonics by feeding the squirrel different letters. We have counted, sequenced and ordered the numbers to 10 and counted the owls in the trees which were really tricky.
