On Wednesday, children enjoyed a movie night in their






#### PIRATES V MERMAIDS – YEAR 3 & YEAR 4 PLAY

# CHILD MENTAL HEALTH WEEK 4th - 7th FEBRUARY 2025

At Sacred Heart School this week, we have been thinking about our Mental Health with a focus on the Child Mental Health Week theme - 'Know yourself, grow yourself'. All Key Stages had a special Mental Health assembly led by Mrs S Griffiths and Mrs HT to think about ways we can learn to recognise how we feel, what to do with uncomfortable feelings and how to develop our resilience. Resources for parents have been sent out on the portal from Place2Be and pupils have been using school resources linked to this.

Our Well-being clubs are thriving at Sacred Heart. We have a Key Stage 2 drop in on Wellbeing Wednesdays and have just started up a Key Stage 1 drop in on Mindful Mondays which has



been extremely well attended. We have also started an Indoor Calm space on a Monday lunchtime for Key Stage 2 and are hoping to add more to our weekly calendar. Children really enjoy the activities and are using their pupil voices to express what they need us to offer them to support well-being and mindfulness in our school.

# RECEPTION

Children in Reception Class have been busy learning about the Luna New Year. We have enjoyed sharing and re-telling the story of 'The Great Race' using ordinal numbers. Last week involved lots of creating: making lanterns and red envelopes using the main colour red, as it brings good luck. We have also had some tricky challenges, writing Chinese numbers and using chop sticks to eat noodles. We watched traditional Chinese dragon dancing and then had a go at moving our dragons in time to the music.



Throughout the term we have been sharing lots of different fairytales. The story of Cinderella has inspired us to create our own castles using watercolour paints.
















# YEAR 5

Children in Year 5 have been learning about forces in Science this term and have been conducting a series of experiments investigating various forces. This week, it was the turn of air resistance! The children had to make parachutes of differing sizes and then record the time it took them to fall. The children worked so well in their pairs and produced some very efficient parachutes.



In Bushcraft with Mr King, children have been making links with their learning about friction in Science. They made pot hangers for cooking over a fire, put up a tarpaulin using friction knots and made a lean-to shelter, thinking about the angle of the roof so that gravity didn't have too much effect on the leaves they had used to cover it. The shelters were constructed using interlocking branches, as opposed to using cordage, and were then tested with water; luckily they stayed dry! In their next session, the children will be learning about the uses of friction for fire-lighting. A big thank you to Mr King for making the sessions so educational and fun for the children!
