

STEM CLUB

The STEM club made structures out of jelly beans and cocktail sticks on Tuesday. The children's challenge was to build the tallest structure that they could. They learnt about how different shapes give structures strength and rigidity. They were a little disappointed that they were not allowed to eat the jelly beans!



YEAR 1

In Science, we looked at how the weather changes throughout the seasons and we have been observing, measuring and recording our findings in a weather report. We enjoyed working outside in the quad, making the most of the mild weather.



We each chose a poem for National Poetry Day and, after some homework practice, we shared reciting them in class. We also read

fun acting it out. We now have loads of excellent ideas to write our own verses.

In anticipation of Harvest, we painted leaves from different trees in beautiful autumn colours and used these to print 'autumn trees'.



'Jump or Jiggle', a great poem about animals and how they move. We had








YEAR 3

Our current topic in RE is Family and Homes. We have been thinking about what makes a happy home and how, by following Jesus' teachings, we can work to make our homes happy places to be. As part of this work, the children wrote poems entitled A Recipe for a Happy Family.



YEAR 5

As part of their English studies this term, Year 5 have been reading and discussing examples of observational poetry. They have looked at poems where the poet describes an ordinary object and makes it extraordinary! The children have analysed poems and looked for poetic features such as: adjectives, alliteration, metaphors, similes, personification, repetition and rhyme. After creating expanded noun phrases, choosing powerful word choices and writing metaphors, Year 5 wrote their own poems to describe the sky. The finished poems were so lively and interesting to read with powerful images!

In Art, Year 5's first project of the new academic year was to look at one point perspective. The children learnt that by using a vanishing point in their drawing, this gives the illusion of distance and depth. The children drew their names using block letters, created a vanishing point and then drew converging lines shooting off the corners of each letter to the vanishing point. The results were very bold and effective!
