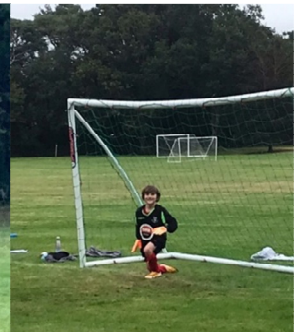

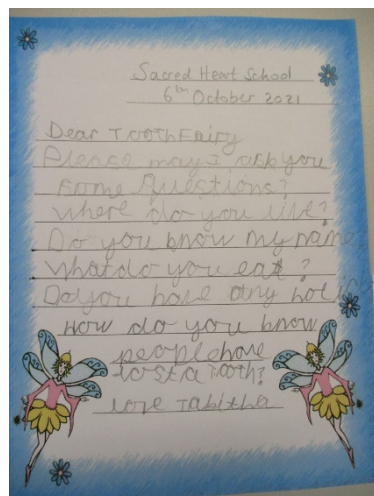


RECEPTION

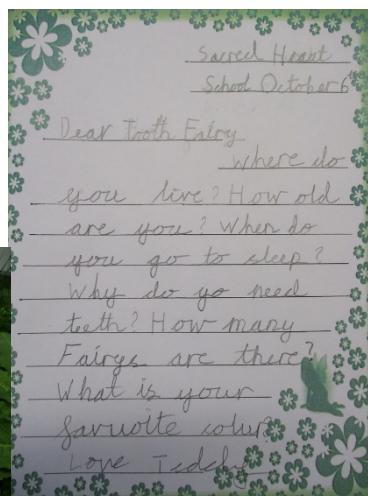
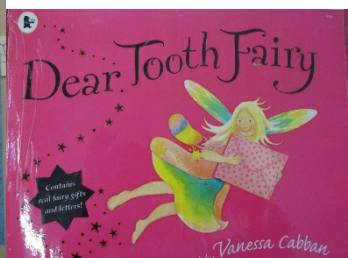

YEAR 2



We've had a very exciting week in Year 2! After reading the lovely book "Dear Tooth Fairy" by Alan Durant, we wrote our own letters to the Tooth Fairy and posted them in our special fairy post box. We were so excited to receive a reply to all the questions we had asked!



In Art, we have had great fun learning how to score and slip with clay and made our own 'funky toucans'! What a creative class Year 2 are!



YEAR 4

In Year 4 this week, we have been learning about the Ancient Sumerian form of writing called cuneiform. The children wrote their names in cuneiform on clay tablets just as people would have done all those years ago! In Geography, we learnt about the causes of earthquakes, where in the world they occur and then we conducted an earthquake experiment in the classroom! Using wooden blocks and Lego bricks, the children were able to demonstrate why buildings in earthquake-prone areas need to be built differently. The building made of wooden blocks certainly didn't last very long once the earthquake started! A messy investigation but lots of fun!



YEAR 6

This week in Year 6, children have been practising for their class assembly, which was inspired by their learning in RE. They have learnt that the parable of The Prodigal Son illustrates how God loves us all unconditionally - no matter what - as long as we are prepared to admit our poor choices and say that we are sorry.
