Louis and Luke took their First Holy Communion on Saturday afternoon with some friends from the parish.


REMINDER FROM THE SCHOOL SHOP

the Nourish Foodbank in Tunbridge Wells, thereby helping our local and our We are asking the children to bring in donations of non-perishable food for


