

Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!


YEAR 2

As part of our Science learning, Year 2 were fortunate enough to receive a very informative visit from Mark White from the charity, Animal Kind. Through the use of some interesting puppets, Y2 learnt how to care for various pets, what they need to keep well and the correct food to give them. We all had a really enjoyable afternoon!









In English, we have been learning about different types of punctuation. In particular, we have learnt how and when to use a question mark. YEAR 3

In our English lessons we have been enjoying the book *Ada Twist Scientist*. In the book, Ada is trying to identify a nasty smell so we undertook a smelling investigation of own! Having ordered a set of instructions, the children then had to follow these and have a go at identifying a number of different smells! The class really learnt the importance of writing clear instructions and being able to follow these methodically.









In our Science topic, we are studying Animals Including Humans. We have been learning about nutrition and keeping healthy, skeletons and muscles. The class were lucky enough to have a visit from Dr Ramjohn who told them all about the human body. They learnt so many interesting facts, handled some different bones, tried to put organs back into body models and even tried out bandaging and suturing!
