# YEAR 5

During Art lessons, Year 5 have been studying Pop Art. They have learnt that Pop Art is a fun form of art which started after the Second World War and was very different to the very serious fine art of the past. Artists often use images that are popular in the modern world such as

celebrities, Disney characters and everyday objects that may be found in the home. The children looked at the work of various Pop Artists, but especially that of Andy Warhol. Using sweet packets, they then created their own Pop Art inspired work. They had to observe the detail carefully on the packets and recreate this detail in their own work. The children used vivid colours and outlined the detail. The results are absolutely fantastic and are certainly very eye catching!
