# Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!

## FOUNDATION STAGE

This week in Foundation Stage we have been looking at worms. We set up a wormery, enjoyed a worm Messy Play and made worm pictures. As an end to our Minibeast topic we had a Bug ball. The children came dressed in the colour of their minibeast and made a head dress at school. They were also able to try some bug food and join in with dancing and games.





# YEAR 1

When we walk into the classroom in the morning, the first thing we do is go and check on our bean plants. It has been very exciting to see the shoots popping out of the soil, shedding their seed coats along the way. Some seem to be growing at a blistering pace while others are growing at a more steady pace. We know that eventually they will all grow into big healthy plants though, so you could say they are a little bit like us! We are keeping our plant diaries up to date too.



We also went for a hunt around the school grounds, looking for wild plants and tallying how many of each kind we saw. We were surprised to find many more than just a dandelion and daisy!



# YEAR 2

In RE, we are learning about the difference between a sin and an accident and the importance of forgiving others if they hurt us. We have learnt that God will always forgive us if we are sorry because He loves us so much. We have looked at examples of forgiveness that Jesus gave us in the Bible to help us explain why forgiveness is so important. The photos show us having fun role playing stories of forgiveness when we make bad choices.





# YEAR 3

In our English lessons this term we have been studying sea stories, in particular Dolphin Boy and The Sandman and the Turtles, both by Michael Morpurgo. The latter proved very popular as you can see from these reviews! Both books provided lots of opportunity for looking at characterisation, setting and plot. The children worked on comparisons between the two, choosing and justifying their favourite. 

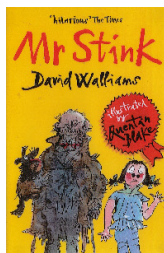

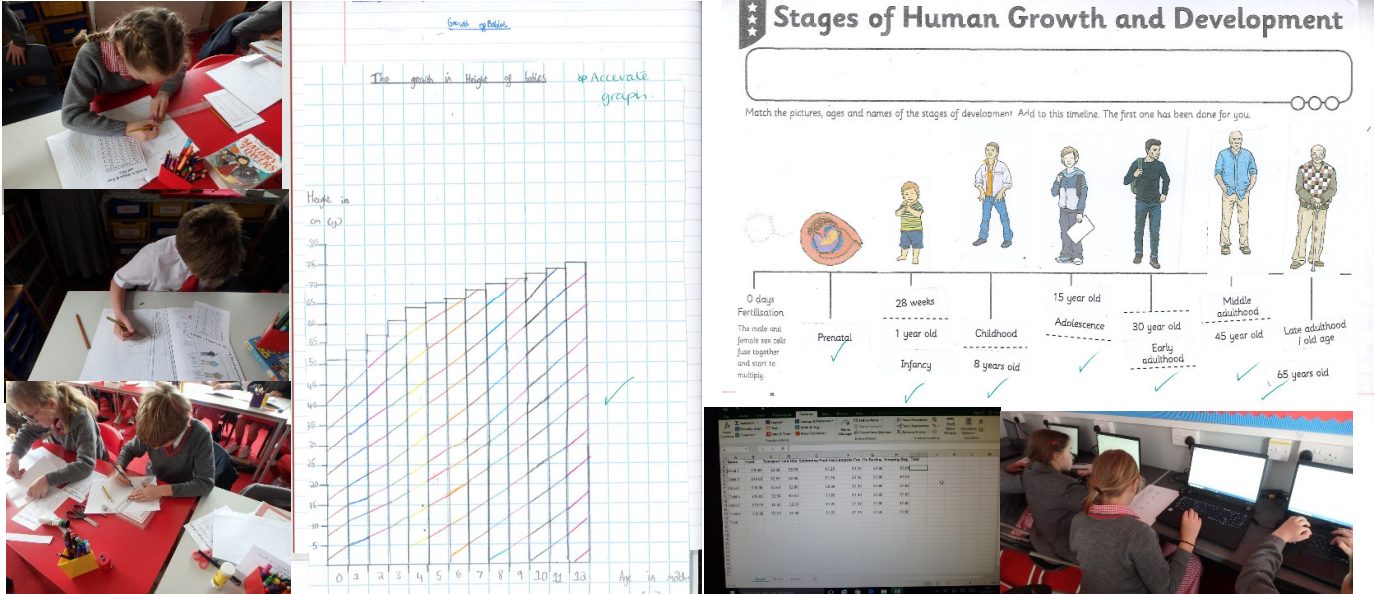

# YEAR 5

This week Year 5 have been using different methods to display data. In Science they have been plotting information about the size of babies as part of their topic on the human life cycle. They plotted line and bar graphs and then decided which they felt showed the data most clearly.

In ICT we are learning to input data into spreadsheets and then using formulae to work out totals. The children are really enjoying using ICT to present data.



# YEAR 6

Children in Year 6 have been learning about the Five Pillars of Islam in RE lessons as part of a focus on Other Faiths. They can explain some of the beliefs of Muslims and give reasons why they behave as they do. Here you can see that they have made leaflets which demonstrate their learning. They have all agreed how interesting it is to learn about the faiths of other people. In Art lessons, they have been making Islamic, geometric patterns too.
