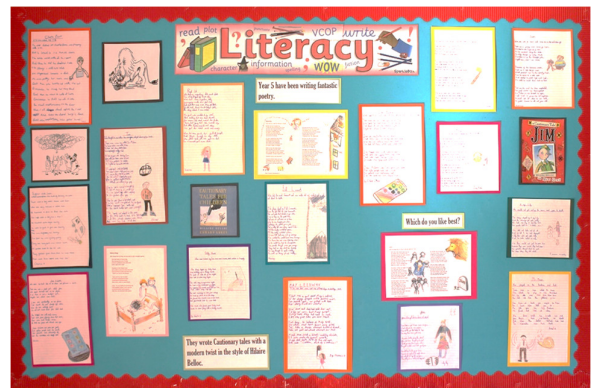
moved and want to thank Father Martin very much for his time.
