#LET'S CONNECT CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK

We have enjoyed activities across the school linked to the message LET'S CONNECT. Each child has made an individual jigsaw piece which has been connected to make an enormous whole school jigsaw trail to remind us of how we connect with each other. On Wellbeing Wednesday, we enjoyed mixing year groups for lunch and siblings were able to eat their lunch together.

At playtime, we joined the whole school together to take a photo of us all connected to each other - Sacred Heart is a big family.

- In Foundation Stage/Key Stage 1 Assembly the children learnt that mental health is all about their feelings • and how this affects the choices they make and how they behave. We all have different emotions including happy, angry, sad, lonely, calm, worried and excited. All feelings are ok. They learnt that they can support their mental health by spending time outside, by listening to music, being with friends and family, learning new things and being active. We ended the assembly by dancing together.
- KS2 had a special wellbeing assembly and took part in a connection activity linking us all together by hands, • feet or shoulders. We thought about who we are connected to and how important those connections are for our mental health and wellbeing. We finished with an IMOVES Wellbeing dance - 'You Can Count on Me'.

Thank you to everybody who took part and we hope that it will help us to focus on the importance of connections to us in school, at home and in our community.



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Tuesday 7th February was National E-Safety Day and the theme this year was "Want to talk about it? Making space for conversations about life online." The children enjoyed a whole day of activities about safe use of the internet and how they should talk to a trusted adult when they have concerns. The day started with a whole school performance of "Pinocchio" which showed the children how he managed to navigate safely through lots of internet problems. He accepted a contact on his iPad from someone he did not know, and then he was tricked - first into making a TikTok video, and then into signing up to an online contract with the evil ring master at the circus. He managed to escape with some help from an online fairy, only to be eaten by a whale! His nose grew as he told a few lies along the way, but eventually he learnt how to use the internet safely and that he should not tell lies.

Classes then had individual workshops with the actors from the performance. Here they played games and acted out scenarios to focus on the theme of talking about problems that may arise from internet use, and also to remember the SMART principles for safe use of the internet:-

- **S** Safe keep your personal information safe
- Meet you should not meet up with anyone you have only ever met online
- **A** Accepting accepting files and opening messages from people you do not know can cause problems
- **R** Reliability check the reliability of information you find out on the internet
- Tell tell a trusted adult if anything on the internet makes you feel uncomfortable

There was a Key Stage 2 Assembly exploring how to use and enjoy the internet and how to discuss and raise questions with trusted adults.

It was a really fun and interactive day with children taking part in lots of exciting activities to reinforce the important message of internet safety and feeling confident to speak up about concerns or worries when using the internet.



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
