



YEAR 2





The children were also tasked with finding as many objects as possible that measured less than 1cm to fit in a matchbox. They found a wonderful range of tiny objects and were then challenged with ordering them by size. The highest number of objects that someone managed in a match box was 36!



YEAR 4

Linked to our History topic, the children in Year 4 were given the task of making a piece of jewellery in a Mayan style over half term. Mayan jewellery contained distinctive patterns or depictions of their gods. The children made some impressive pieces using a range of materials including clay, wood and even household items such as tin foil and card. Well done Year 4!



YEAR 5

Year 5 completed their poetry module by learning to recite a Cautionary Tale. They were given a choice of three: Jim, Matilda or Algernon, and were asked to learn the words over half-term so that they could perform the poem to the rest of the class. They were asked to think about performance techniques, and in particular, adding expression, using a clear and loud voice and considering the use of actions.

The children all performed their poems on Monday and although they were a little nervous, they all managed to

recite the poems beautifully. All the children received merits and marbles for their performance, but a few were given a special prize. Special congratulations go to Lettie, who won first prize as she used a fantastic range of expression and actions in her recital. Laila and Bea Bea were worthy runners up. Charlie was awarded a special prize for learning and reciting his own poem and also helping and supporting another child by joining them in their recital.
