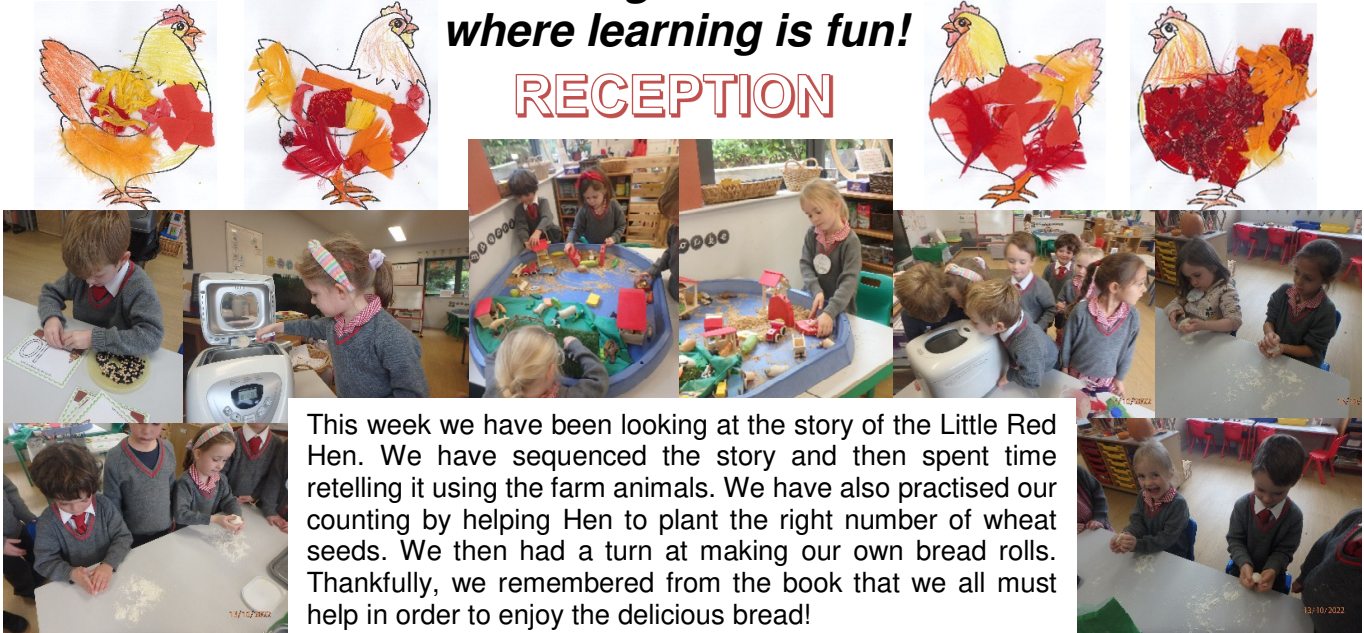

YEAR 2

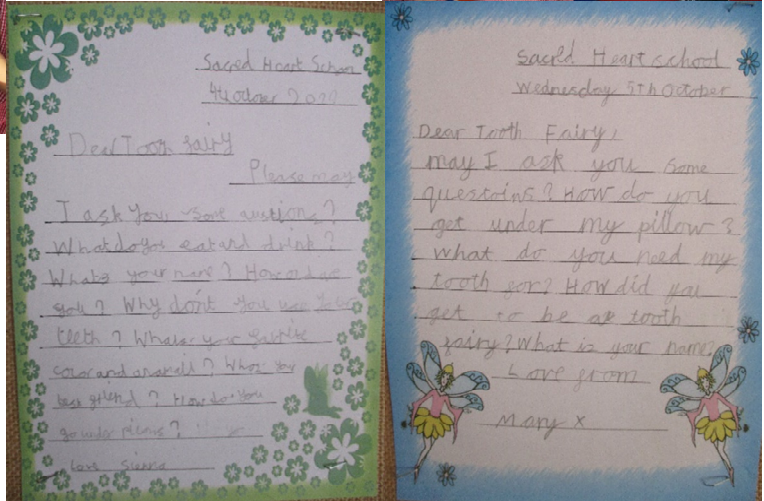

Year 3 Class Assembly

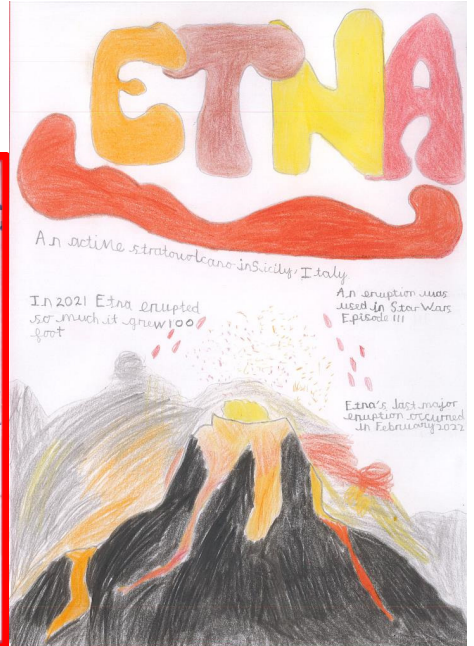
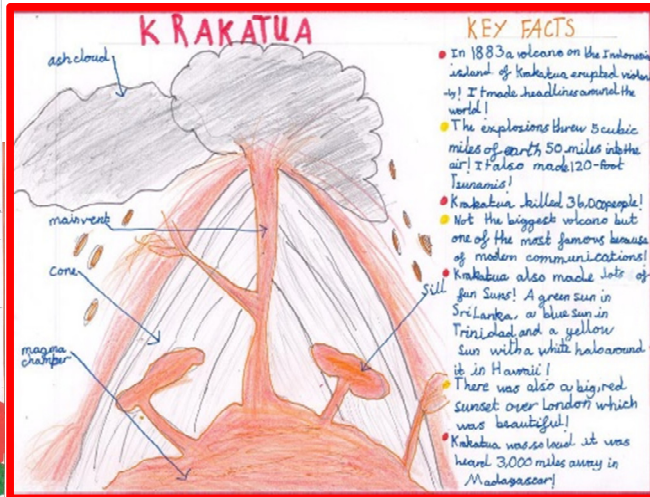
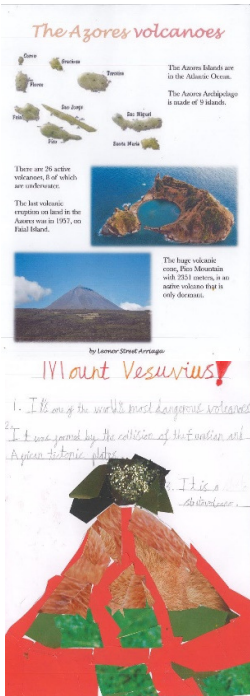

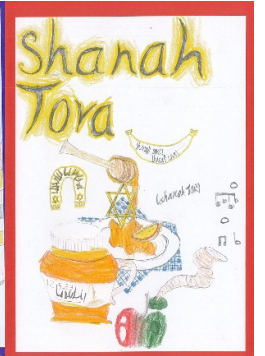
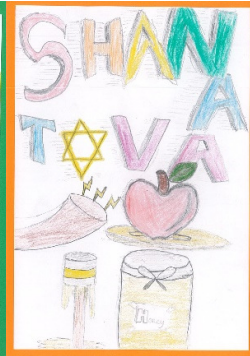
YEAR 4

YEAR 6

In R.E. lessons this week, children in Year 6 have been learning about Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year) and Yom Kippur (the Day of Atonement). They have learnt about the sounding of the shofar in the synagogue and they understand its link to the story of Abraham and Isaac from the Old Testament. Some children spotted how Abraham's deep faith in God was like that of Our Lady because they both trusted God implicitly, saying 'yes' to whatever was asked of them. To celebrate Rosh Hashanah, Jewish people eat apples with honey to symbolise the 'sweet New Year'. The boys and girls in Year 6 enjoyed tasting them too! They have also designed their own Rosh Hashanah greetings cards to show that they have increased their knowledge and understanding of another faith.



In Outdoor Learning lessons this half term, children have had a wonderful time, digging a new pond, building shelters, creating artwork with an autumnal theme for a collaborative piece and helping to put together the outdoor learning space. They even used the outdoors to help with poetry writing on National Poetry Day.
