Children then presented their research and answered questions on their chosen person to explain their choice and how they had

All these personalities were very different and achieved different goals, but one thing they all had in common was a growth mind set, a love of their neighbours, and a "can do" attitude. This is something we have also been exploring at school this week in Assemblies and in our lessons.
