REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY PARADE – Sunday 13th November



Wadhurst is holding the annual Remembrance Sunday Parade on 13th November. If you would like to join us to represent the school, please meet us at Sparrows Green at 9:45am. Children should be dressed in full uniform, including blazer and hat. The Parade leaves from Wadhurst Primary School at 10am and there will be an Act of Remembrance at Wadhurst War Memorial

at 10:15-10:30. Some of our older pupils will carry our school banner in the parade and a couple of children will lay the wreath during the Act of Remembrance.

POPPIES

Year 6 children will be visiting classes throughout next week with poppies and a donation tin from the local British Legion. We ask that if children would like to buy a poppy, they should bring in a suggested donation of 50p. If they would like some of the larger items (stationery, pins, wristbands), they should bring in around £1.00 - \pounds 2.00. Poppies will also be on sale at the end of the day at the rope. Children are welcome to wear their poppies to school and we will of course be holding a two-minute silence on Friday 11th November.

NURSERY



This week we have been learning about Diwali. We designed Rangoli patterns with coloured pasta, painted Mehndi patterns on our hands and made Diya lights. We have linked this festival to Bonfire Night. We have also explored 'shredded paper fire and fire engines' and made beautiful fireworks with paint and glitter.





YEAR 1

We are learning about Baptism in RE and some of us brought in precious artefacts from our own christening to share with our friends.

In phonics, we are trying to remember many new sounds this half term and are working hard to learn our spellings. We had fun searching for the word cards Floppy had cheekily hidden around the classroom. Then we had even more fun hiding them ourselves for our friends to find them.



We enjoyed writing our own verses of the Jump and Jiggle poem inside animal shapes.



YEAR 3

In Year 3 we have been learning about the Rainforests in Geography and, as part of their half-term homework, the children were challenged to make a model of a rainforest. As you can see, the children produced some amazing models! There was such a wonderful variety of approaches to the task; the models were really detailed with so many different materials and skills utilised. The children were very proud of their work and the models have really brightened up the Year 3 classroom and corridor outside. Well done Year 3!



YEAR 5

In Science, Year 5 have been learning about different theories about the solar system and how these have developed over time. At first, scientists believed that the solar system followed a geocentric model, with the Earth at the centre and all the planets and the sun orbiting around the Earth. Copernicus and then Galileo were later able to prove that in fact the solar system is heliocentric (with the Sun at the centre) with all the planets orbiting around the Sun. As a half-term project, the children all made posters to demonstrate the two different

ideas about the solar system and explain how they differ. Their posters were all beautifully completed and clearly demonstrate and explain the two different systems. Their work now forms a fantastic science display in the corridor outside Year 5.

In English lessons, they have been writing "Just So Stories", copying Rudyard Kipling's style to explain how animals got their distinctive features. There is a display of the finished stories in the classroom. You can find out all about how the zebra got its stripes because it was so vain, or the pelican got its large beak because it was so greedy. Each story has a moral so there are many handy tips as well!
