# YEAR 3

The children then chose the colour they wanted to use for their print and, rolling the ink onto their tile, they created really striking prints, some of which can be seen below.













## YEAR 5

Year 5 have been reading a range of stories by Shaun Tan, which have fantastic illustrations, which often tell part of the story. They really enjoyed the story "Cicada" and made their own information posters about cicadas



and their lifecycle. This really helped them to understand the story, which compares elements of working in an office to the insect lifecycle. Many of his stories also raise issues about being different and being an outsider and reactions to this. Year 5 have enjoyed debating these issues and thinking about how we treat those in society who are different, and whether we sometimes bully, ignore or exclude some people just



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because they are different. Everyone enjoyed the story of "The Lost Thing". Children created their own "lost things", drafted original designs, and

detailed descriptions for them. The next step is to write their own short stories, with illustrations, which copy aspects of Shaun Tan's style.



In ICT everyone enjoyed learning about different ways of sending information, and they experimented with sending messages using Semaphore flags and Morse Code. This was great fun, but we all agreed that you would need to practise quite a lot to get very good! Year 5 are now focusing on Excel, how to create simple databases, then use formulae to create automatic data calculations.
