Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!

NURSERY

This week Nursery have been learning about Diwali. They have made Divas, created Rangoli patterns, made Mehndi patterns on hand outlines and explored the different colours in fireworks.



YEAR 1

For our topic on Baptism, we went into the church where Father Martin explained how, through Baptism, a baby becomes part of God's family. Back in our classroom, we tried to use the same important symbols and words to Baptise a baby ourselves. Some children brought in their very own Baptismal candle. We talked about Remembrance in History and RE and made colourful poppies in Art. In English we practised reciting the refrain of 'Harvey Slumfenburger's Christmas Present' with lots of expression. Finally, in Maths, we continued with using the part whole model and tried to write different number sentences for the same model and to find different ways of partitioning the same whole, all the while trying to explain what we were doing using good vocabulary.

In Year 3 we have been learning about the Rainforests and, as part of their half-term homework, the children were challenged to make a model of a rainforest. As you can see, the children produced some fantastic models. There was such a wonderful variety of approaches to the task; the models were really detailed with so many different materials and skills utilised. The children were very proud of their work and were able to speak about it beautifully too. Well done Year 3!



YEAR 5

In Science, Year 5 have been learning all about the solar system, different theories about the solar system and how these developed over time. At first scientists believed that the solar system followed a Geocentric model, with the Earth at the centre and all the planets and the sun orbiting around the Earth. Copernicus and then Galileo were later able to prove that in fact the Solar system is Heliocentric, with the Sun at the centre and all the planets orbiting around the Sun. As a half-term project, the children all made posters to demonstrate the two different ideas about the solar system and explain how they differ. Their posters were all beautifully completed and clearly show and explain the two different systems. Their work now forms a fantastic science display in the corridor outside Year 5.



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In History lessons, Year 5 have been learning about The Indus Valley Civilisation which was centred on the Indus River in modern day northeast Afghanistan, Pakistan and northwest India. The civilisation began around 3200BC and was abandoned by about 1300BC. The children were asked to create a mini project based on either houses and architecture, clothing and jewellery or farming and diet. They all produced absolutely fantastic work which included posters, information leaflets and books and models. Individually, the children then explained to the class how they made and created their masterpieces and what they had learnt from their research. Very well done Year 5!
