This year marks the 100-year anniversary of the return of the body of the Unknown Soldier to be buried in Westminster Abbey. On Wednesday 11 November at 11.00am, each class observed the two-minute silence before two pupil representatives walked to the Memorial in Wadhurst to lay a wreath on behalf of the school community.
