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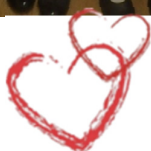

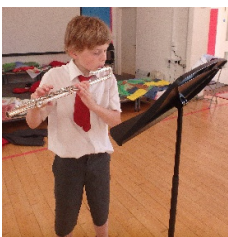

FLUTE & CLARINET LESSONS

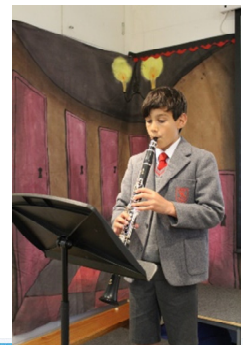


Flute and Clarinet lessons have been back in person this term, with the instrumentalists really enjoying their 'live' lessons and making great progress.

RECEPTION

We created Pop Art Ties, inspired by Andy Warhol to give to our lovely daddies for Father's Day.



YEAR 1

In Maths we unravelled the mystery of what kind of animals Noah could have seen passing by his door at night-time on the Ark. One night he saw 12 legs, the other night 16 and then another night 18. We worked out many different combinations of animals for the different numbers and noted them all down in our booklets.

Our bean plants have grown nice and tall and we needed a metre stick to measure them! We recorded all the heights in our bean diary.

Greenpeace and whales have been the focus of our attention in the English lessons as we are reading 'Dear Greenpeace'.

We wrote letters to our friends in the class about what we think might be in Emily's pond. We remembered all the capital letters and full stops and ended our letters with a question. It was great fun opening them and sharing them with each other.



YEAR 2

We have been looking closely at birds in Art in Year 2. We made a collaborative peacock for display by making our own marbled paper for the feathers using shaving foam and food dye. It was very messy but great fun! We also used watercolour resist techniques with oil pastels to create a different type of feather. We then carefully followed instructions on how to draw our own peacocks and tried hard to use colour blending techniques with oil pastels to create our own peacock pictures.



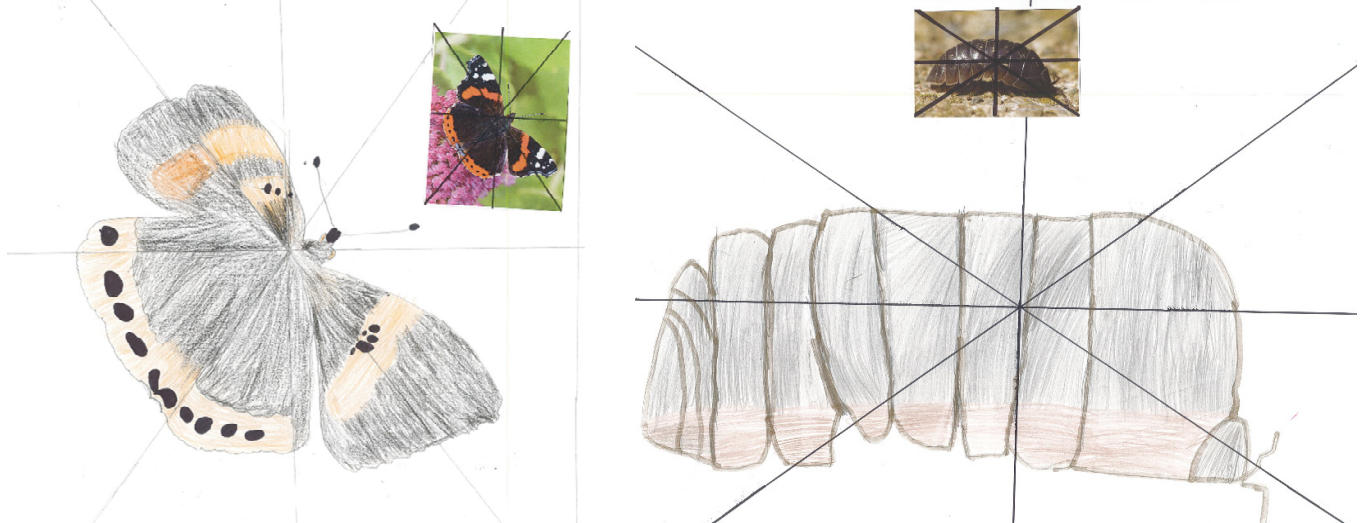
YEAR 3

In Year 3 we have been studying plants in our Science lessons. In a crossover with our Art lessons, the children made watercolour flowers, adding in the reproductive parts of the flower using Blu-tack and cotton buds! The finished flowers look beautiful and are brightening up the corner of the classroom.



YEAR 4

In Art this week, Year 4 have been looking at the work of the photographer Levon Biss and his amazing insect portraits. The photographs show intricate detail and the children enjoyed trying to draw their own 'enormous insects' by using a grid method. The children have also been learning about the greenhouse effect and global warming and replicated this in a science investigation. They took two thermometers outside to a sunny spot and put a glass (which replicated the greenhouse gases) over just one of them. They then recorded the temperature readings of the two thermometers, coming to the conclusion that the glass had increased the temperature.



YEAR 5

Year 5 are learning about famous scientists and inventors and their work this term. They have been studying the work of Leonardo Da Vinci and discovered that not only was he an artist but also a sculptor, architect, engineer, scientist, inventor and writer!

Leonardo da Vinci is considered by many people to be one of the most intelligent people of all time. 'The Vitruvian Man' is an ink drawing by Leonardo da Vinci. It shows a man in two superimposed positions. The drawing is based on da Vinci's ideas about the proportions of the human body and da Vinci describes these proportions in his notes around the drawing.

The children have been measuring each other to see if Da Vinci's ideas about the proportions of the body are true!



In Art lessons, Year 5 have been learning about Pop Art and have been looking at the work of Andy Warhol and Roy Lichtenstein. They created their own Pop Art onomatopoeia inspired by the work of Lichtenstein:



YEAR 6

This week in Year 6, children have been rehearsing for the end of year musical and making the props too. They have been making batik-style textile pieces with an Alice in Wonderland theme in Art. In Science, they have been learning about the Digestive and Circulatory Systems and Social Justice in R.E.
