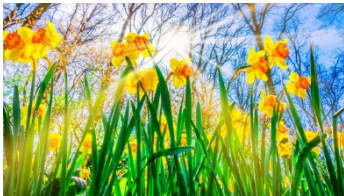

YEAR 1

In RE, a very important time in the Church year has begun with the start of Lent. We have been reflecting on what we will try to do during Lent, our Lenten promise, thinking about both Jesus and the people around us.

We have been very excited to start sewing in our Art lesson, a new skill for many of us. We have all carefully chosen our favourite colours of Binca and wool to make a lovely surprise for someone very special.



YEAR 3

As part of our Science topic on Rocks and Soils the children made their own fossils. They learnt about how 'mould and cast' fossils are formed; using clay, shells and Plaster of Paris they created their very own fossils. They were very pleased with how realistic they looked! In English we have been learning about Greek Myths. One of the stories the children heard was that of Arachne the Spinner. Inspired by this, the children learnt how to fold a piece of paper to create lines that they could then use to draw a spider's web. They then coloured in their webs choosing the patterns and colours they liked. They are very eye-catching!



YEAR 5

As part of our history topic on the Vikings, Year 5 have been learning about Viking long ships. They have learnt that the ships were skilfully built to sail fjords, rivers and seas with ease in order to explore, pirate and combat. The ships usually measured approximately 25-30 metres in length, could carry up to 60 men and were steered by an oar at the back of the boat. A figurehead at the front of the ship was used to scare the enemy.

During Half Term, the children were asked to make their own versions of a Viking long ship using any materials that they felt were most suitable. The results were absolutely fantastic! A variety of media was used for their ships including clay, card, Lego and wood.

The attention to detail and expert craftsmanship ensured that each ship was made to replicate the original! Excellent work, Year 5!
