# Another busy and exciting week at Sacred Heart School where learning is fun!

## RECEPTION

This week Reception took part in 'Teamwork Tuesday' to support Anti-Bullying Week. We learnt that working with others, communicating and sharing our ideas in our play meant that collectively we create something far better then we could on our own! We enjoyed practising these skills during large scale building! For the second half of the week we have been learning about Road Safety. We have spoken about all the Road Safety Heroes that help keep us safe and then we were able to become School Crossing Patrols! We have made stop signs, collaged traffic lights and even took to the playground for some role play. We look forward to a walk next week, where we will venture out to our local area and be safe when using the roads.



## YEAR 2

As part of our 'Healthy Me' topic, Year 2 carried out investigations into how far a sneeze can travel and how best to wash our hands to eliminate germs. We used glitter to demonstrate how germs can be passed from person to person and discovered that only with warm water and soap will all the germs disappear. We also discovered that a 'sneeze' can travel as far as 1 metre in distance and that germs can live on a surface for up to 2 days!

This half term, Year 4 have been looking at the topic of 'sound' in their Science lessons. The children took a 'Sound Walk' around the school grounds and made a note of the sounds that they could hear. They then thought about what objects had vibrated to create these air vibrations. We also investigated how the volume and pitch could be altered on various musical instruments....very noisy but fun!



## YEAR 6

In Year 6 recently, children have been improving their writing skills through the study of The Firework Maker's Daughter. They have considered gender stereotypes and discussed parental expectations as well as having fun using role play to better understand the characters in the novel.



Some of the children have been hard at work taking ISEB exams, whilst others have been representing the school in cross country competitions and matches. They have also been learning about the ordination of a priest in RE and Roman baths in Latin - another very busy week in Year 6!
