PEOPLE WHO HELP US

Over the past few weeks, children in Foundation Stage have been fortunate to welcome several special visitors as part of our "People Who Help Us" topic. These visits have provided exciting, hands-on learning opportunities and helped the children understand the important roles that different helpers play.

We were delighted to have a police officer visit us who brought along a uniform for the children to try on — a real highlight! Mrs Fitzpatrick also joined us to talk about her work as a vet, sharing insights into caring for animals. Mr Paton-Philip came to speak about his role as a lawyer, helping the children learn about how lawyers support people with rules and justice. Additionally, Dr Ramjohn spoke to the children about her role in helping care for people's health. The children even got to practise some medical skills themselves, safely using bandages and syringes, and measuring each other's heartbeats with a stethoscope. Finally, Dr Farah Ramjohn visited to discuss what it's like to be a dentist, explaining the importance of keeping our teeth healthy. We thank all our visitors for their time and enthusiasm.
