# RECEPTION



Following a chilly start to the year, children in Reception have been learning about winter. As part of this topic, the children went on to explore cold environments and the animals that live there. They particularly enjoyed reading *Lost and Found*, which inspired thoughtful discussion, storytelling and creative activities. The children created their own penguins and igloos, as well as hats and gloves designed to keep warm. They also practised writing and drawing by recording items they would pack in a suitcase for a journey to the South Pole.



Reception have also been busy preparing for their Candlemas Assembly with the Year 6 children. The children worked carefully and collaboratively with their Buddies to decorate their glass jars.





## YEAR 5

Children in Year 5 have been exploring thermal conductivity in Science by planning and carrying out their own practical investigation. They wrapped five cups of warm water in different materials — foil, bubble wrap, tissue paper, plastic and fabric — and then carefully monitored how the temperature changed over time. To ensure accurate and reliable results, the children used data loggers with temperature probes to measure and record the temperature of the water at regular intervals. This helped them see clearly which materials were better insulators and why some materials slow down heat loss more effectively than others. Throughout the investigation, pupils worked scientifically by making predictions, recording data and discussing what their findings showed.
