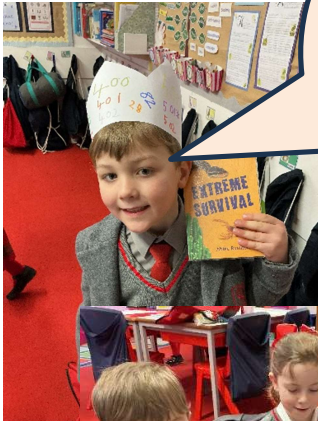

My favourite has been "Poetry is NOT for me!" because it's such a funny story and made me laugh out loud!



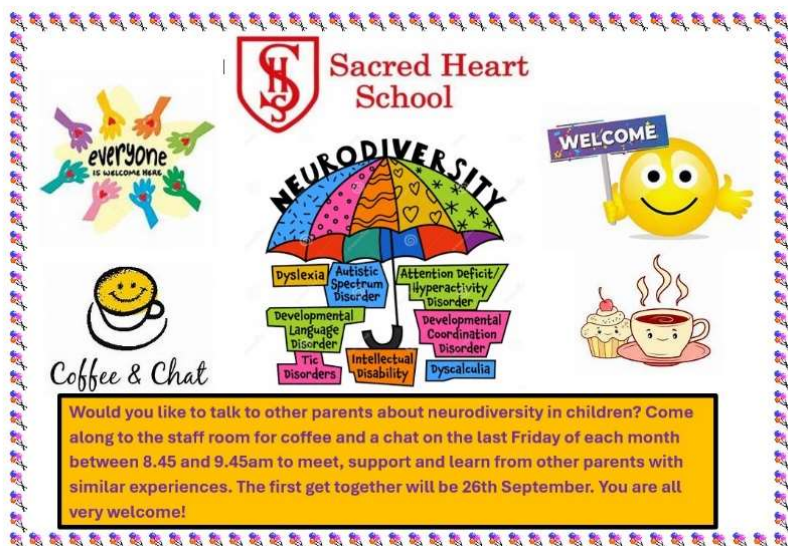
Listening to the Year 2 children read is such a privilege with these new books! I am learning lots of interesting facts and loving seeing how much pleasure the children are having from their reading!
