## YEAR 2

The children in Year 2 have thoroughly enjoyed looking at the story of "The Owl Who was Afraid of the Dark" by Jill Tomlinson. After having learnt some artistic techniques such as blending, pointillism, hatching and cross-hatching, they have used sketching pencils to draw some beautiful detailed barn owls. They have also loved using the IPads to research interesting facts about barn owls, and their blurbs for the story will, I hope, inspire anyone who hasn't read this brilliant story to go and read it immediately! ## YEAR 3

In Geography, the children in Year 3 have been learning about the structure of the earth and the layers that make it up. The children made miniature globes, building up the layers from the inner core, and out to the outer core, the mantle and finally the crust. They then added the oceans and land. Once complete, they cut through their globes to reveal the layers inside. The 'reveal' proved very exciting!










In Science, the class are learning about plants. As part of this topic, they have been looking at seed dispersal and designed posters to show the seven methods of seed dispersal there are. They also make paper-copters to mimic sycamore seeds and investigated whether the size of their paper-copters affected how long they took to fall. The class went on to investigate whether weight and material affected the performance of the seed. They discovered that weight is so important and dandelion seeds really have got it sussed!

Foundation Stage had an exciting end to their Minibeast Topic: they came to school dressed in the colour of their favourite minibeast. They then had a feast of 'worms in jelly' and 'ants on toast', giving them energy to wiggle and waggle at the Ugly Bug Ball!
