YEAR 5

Children in Year Five have been enjoying activities in Forest School over the last few weeks. As part of their Science studies about asexual reproduction in plants, they each prepared their own geranium cutting and planted some potatoes. As both plants reproduce asexually, making clones of themselves, children should be able to grow their own geranium plants from their cuttings, and later in the year, enjoy sharing a crop of potatoes. They really enjoyed making shelters, using items available in nature and around them in the school field. They were divided into two teams and were tasked with building sturdy shelters which could fit all their team. They were also told to prepare for wet weather conditions. As an extra treat, they took turns sitting by the campfire and eating a pizza, freshly baked on the campfire by Mrs. Cobb. Once the shelters were complete, the whole team got inside and then water was poured over the shelter. Some children got very wet - but they all loved the experience, and both shelters just about accommodated the whole team and stayed in place! The children worked very well in their teams, and as both shelters met the challenge, each team received an award for Forest School Teamwork. Thanks to Mrs. Cobb for making this such an enjoyable learning experience! The children are already looking forward to Forest School in Year 6!
