Liturgical year	Also known as the Church year consists of the cycle of liturgical seasons in Christian churches
E-Safety	The safe and responsible use of technology.
Growth Mindset	Individuals who believe their talents can be developed through hard work and good strategies.
Time connectives	A word or phrase which refers to the time in a sentence and tells the reader when an action is happening
Adjectives	Adjectives are words that describe, making your writing and speaking much more specific.
Poems	A piece of writing in which the expression of feelings and ideas is given intensity by particular attention to diction, sometimes involving rhyme.
Place Value	The value of where a digit is in the number – ie: tens and ones.
Shape Properties	The number of sides and vertices (corners) of a 2D shape. The number of faces, edges and vertices of a 3D shape.
Partition	A way of splitting numbers into smaller parts to make them easier to work with – ie: 34 – 3 tens and 4 ones.
