Mrs Wroblewski's Message


Dear Parents,

Parking

The parish would like to implement a more efficient system to monitor parking and manage available spaces in the parish car park. This means that there will be changes to the way parents and visitors of the school use the car park.

Going forward, the parish car park can still be used for school drop offs and pick-ups as normal.

However, if you are attending the school for an event or a meeting, then you will need to collect a visitor pass from the school office and display this clearly in your car to avoid receiving a ticket. We are very sorry that some of our parents and visitors have recently received tickets and hopefully this new measure will ensure that this no longer happens.

For whole school events, where a large number of parents will need to park their cars, we will liaise with the parish beforehand to ensure parking is available without a pass.

Book Cafe


We are holding and book café on Thursday the 6th of March and would love you to come and have a coffee and share a book with your child. Please join us

We are also holding a giant book swap! Please send in any unwanted, but in good condition, children's books to school on Thursday the 6th and the children will be able to swap them for a different one.




Book Fair

Target Throw Challenge

- KS1: Set up targets like soft toys or cushions on the floor. Stand a few meters away and toss rolled-up socks to hit the targets. Count how many you can hit in 1 minute.
- KS2: Increase the distance from the targets or place them at different heights (e.g., on chairs or shelves). Add a point system for each target and try to beat your score in 2 minutes.
