

Elder: Isabelle - "For showing resilience with column multiplication ".



We are also holding a giant book swap! Please send in any unwanted, but in good condition, children's books to school on Thursday the 6th and the children will be able to swap them for a different one.




Book Fair

There will be a special lunch menu on Thursday 6^{th March} For World Book Day.





Online Safety

Please check your inbox for the March 2025 Online Safety
Newsletter. This month covers key topics including the risks and
safeguards related to Artificial Intelligence (AI), the impact
of smartphone use on children's mental health, and TikTok
safety measures like privacy settings and family pairing. It also
provides resources on NSPCC's "Talk PANTS" campaign, safe online
gaming via LEGO Arcade, and guidance on child-friendly messaging
apps like Stars Messenger.

Child Car Seat Safety Events

From February -March 2025 car safety events will be delivered by the Good Egg Safety, supported by Lancashire County Council

These free, community events will take place at a variety of supermarkets in specifically targeted areas and aim to educate parents/carers, grandparents and anyone who drives with children in their vehicle on how to correctly fit a child car seat to their vehicle.

The team will demonstrate how to correctly install the child car seat or inform the driver if a car seat is unsuitable for some reason.

General road safety literature will be offered to take away with them.

Many of the mistakes' people make surrounding child car seats are simple and easy to avoid, including seats belts needing tightening, harnesses not being in the right position and incorrect head restraints? simple, yet potentially lifesaving. Pop along for free advice and an independent check.


