

A big thank you to everyone who came along to support. The children were thrilled afterwards, and they should be really proud of themselves.



Earrings Reminder

Dear Parents and Carers,

To help keep everyone safe and active in PE, we follow the guidance from afPE and Lancashire PE Advisors. This means all jewellery, including earrings and piercings, must be removed before the lesson starts





- Children come to school without earrings or jewellery.
- If your child has recently had their ears pierced and cannot remove the earrings yet, they will not be able to take part in the practical activities. They will join in with a safe, adapted role instead.
- Staff cannot remove or tape earrings for children, and we are not able to look after jewellery.
- If you're planning to get your child's ears pierced, the summer holidays are the best time so they have plenty of time to heal.




