


The Spring Term in Pine Class.

After the half term, we will be learning about the spider and the fly.





In Science we are learning about Forces and Magnets.




In maths we are looking at multiplication, division, time and fractions.

Saint Clare's Catholic Primary School Year Group Curriculum Map





How can you help us this half term?

- Encourage the children to tell the time at home. E.g What time is it? The food needs 10 minutes. what time will it be done?
 - Support spelling practise at home and have discussions about new words.
 - Encourage the children to write at home. E.g. shopping lists, diaries, letters to family and friends. Notes from phone calls.

- Ensure children wear the correct uniform including their ties. PE is on a Monday.
 - Ensure children bring their reading diaries in everyday.
 - Let me know if I can help you in any way.

Reading

- The children can change their reading books when they have finished their books but it must be signed by an adult.
- Please comment in your child's reading journal about their progress and about any discussions you have had with them while reading their book.
- We understand that some children will read their books quickly but please encourage children to read little and often.
- Each child has a question bookmark. Please pick at least 3 questions a night to ask your children from the bookmark.



Vocabulary Questions with Victor

- What does this word/phrase/sentence tell you about the character/setting/mood?
- By writing in this way, what effect has the author created?
- What other words/phrases could the author have used here?
- How has the author made you feel by writing...?



Retrieval Questions with Rex

- Who are the characters in this text?
- When / where is this story set? How do you know?
- Which part of the story best describes the setting?
- What do you think is happening here?
- What might this mean?



Summarising Questions with Sheba

- What is the main point in this paragraph?
- Sum up what has happened so far in X words or less.
- Which is the most important point in these paragraphs?
- Do any sections/paragraphs deal with the same themes?




Be an Author with Arlo

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National Numeracy Challenge

The National Numeracy Strategy is to help your child to enjoy maths through engaging activities that are **done together with an adult**.

How can you help?


Our first impressions of maths and numbers were influenced by the grown-ups around us. We can make sure our children have a positive introduction to numbers even if we didn't. Here are the National Numeracy's Top Tips.

If you have any questions or feedback, please speak to your class teacher at the end of the meeting. Positive or negative comments are welcome as it helps us to report back to the National Numeracy Strategy team.

Top Tip 1:

Point out maths in the real world

Include your child in activities involving numbers and measuring, such as shopping, cooking and travelling.



Top Tip 2:

Be positive about maths

Try not to say things like "I can't do maths" or "I hated maths at school" - your child may start to think like that themselves.



Top Tip 3:

Praise effort, rather than talent

This shows them that by working hard, they can always improve.



Top Tip 4:

Improve your own confidence

With a little help from us, you can build your number confidence and skills and begin to feel more prepared for when children come to you for help. Take the first steps in just 10 minutes with the National Numeracy Challenge.


MINUTES LATE TO SCHOOL	IMPACT ON YOUR ATTENDANCE IN 1 YEAR
5 MINUTES PER DAY =	3.4 DAYS MISSED 98.4% ATTENDANCE
10 MINUTES PER DAY =	6.9 DAYS MISSED 97.6% ATTENDANCE
15 MINUTES PER DAY =	10.3 DAYS MISSED 94.6% ATTENDANCE
20 MINUTES PER DAY =	13.8 DAYS MISSED 92.9% ATTENDANCE
30 MINUTES PER DAY =	20.7 DAYS MISSED 89.2% ATTENDANCE

ATTEND TO ACHIEVE!

Attendance percentages as Number of days and lessons missed from school.
Students are required to attend school for 190 days each year.

Attendance during one school year	Equals days absent	Which is approximately weeks absent	Which means this number of lessons missed	Absence over 5 years
95%	9 days	2 weeks	50 lessons	¼ year
90%	19 days	4 weeks	100 lessons	½ year
80%	38 days	8 weeks	200 lessons	1 year
70%	59 days	12 weeks	300 lessons	1½ years
60%	80 days	16 weeks	400 lessons	2 years
50%	100 days	20 weeks	500 lessons	2 ½ years

Government (DfE) research suggests that **16 days** absence or 92% attendance in any one year equals a **full GCSE drop** in attainment
How does your attendance compare with this target?



Did you know?

When children attend school they:

- Can achieve their full potential
- Have better career prospects
- Learn how to look after themselves
- Learn how to be healthy
- Grow in confidence
- Keep up with work and homework
- Make new friends

A two-week holiday in term-time means the **highest** attendance your child can get is **94.7%**. This is 65 hours of missed school time.

From the moment they come into the classroom the learning begins.


