tradition	An act that has been continued and carried down overtime.
theme	A message or idea hidden in a story. Stories often have more than one theme. E.g. good over evil.
Physical features	Natural features on earth including mountains and rivers.
Human features	Features that have been made or changed by humans including buildings, bridges and roads.
Similarities	What is the same or close to the same between two or more items.
differences	What is not the same about two or more items?
compare	To look two or more items and think about what is the same or different for each item.
chronological	A record of events following the order in which they occurred.
evidence	A sign or item which shows that something exists or is true.
