<u>Vocabulary</u>	
díssolve	The act of solid particles disintegrating into a liquid.
solubility	The degree at which a substance will dissolve into a liquid.
evaporating	When liquid turns into a gas through the action of heating.
reversible changes	Changes that are made to a material that through the opposite action can be returned back to its original state eg. melting ice/freezing water.
irreservible changes	Changes that are made to a material that can be reversed eg. boiling an egg.
seperation	When two or more materials that have been mixed are removed from each other.
filtration	The separation of solids from a liquid by passing the solution through a material with tiny holes.
sieving	The separation of solids from a liquid by passing the solution through a material with small holes.
evacuation	The removal of children from the city to the country during WWII, to live with new families, in order to distance them from danger.
trenches	Large ditches dug into the ground, to protect the soldiers on the front line.
