Dear Parents/Carers,

As my first half term at St Michael's draws to a close, can I start by saying a huge thank you to you all. I have been made to feel so very welcome, not only by your children and staff in school, but also by the parents and carers that I have met at our evening events in recent weeks. I am so enjoying composing these Friday letters to you, as they give me an opportunity to share the wealth of experiences there are to celebrate here, and to reflect on how privileged I feel to have joined 'Team St Michael's'. This week has been no exception in terms of opportunities. It was wonderful to start the week with worship led by Mr Fraser. He talked about one of our tutorial patrons, Dan Walker, and described how, as a newsreader and television presenter, faith shapes how he lives his life. We were reminded of the importance of friendship in our relationships and were encouraged to consider how we too can make a difference in the way we live.

Yesterday afternoon, Miss Curtis kindly took the time to show me some more of the Year 9 enrichment activities on offer. What a great choice pupils have! I saw one group working towards the creation of animated prosthetic hands, others baking butterfly cakes to be delivered to the United Reformed Church Open Kitchen, dance, art, and pupils working on the allotment, and that's to name but a few! She told me all about the team, her kart, and the competitions that they take part in, I so enjoyed our chat. I believe the kart comes out at Open Evening for all to see, so that is something I shall certainly look forward to!

I've met some other pupils this week too, after their teachers nominated them to receive a 'Headteacher's Gold Stamp'. Ethan and Joseph in Year 8 showed me their fabulous lamp boxes, created for design technology, Sophie in Year 7 had excelled in effort with her reading homework, Alice in Year 8 had coded a 'rock, paper, scissors' game on the computer, and Poppy in Year 10 showed me photo evidence of a phenomenal Swiss roll that she had baked and decorated. I'm not sure the cake lasted long in real life; it looked so delicious!

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This week's sporting news includes the Year 7 girls' football team who played in the Chorley and District tournament on Tuesday. After coming joint top on points, they came second overall to Bishop Rawsthorne, who managed to secure just one goal more, a brilliant effort all round! The Chorley and District indoor athletics took place for Years 7 and 8 on Thursday evening. The Year 7 and 8 girls' teams both came second, as did the Year 8 boys' team. However, after some outstanding performances, the Year 7 boys won gold by 13 points and will now represent Chorley in the Lancashire finals in March. Just amazing!

With our ongoing careers programme, we really endeavour to prepare pupils for life beyond St Michael's. The growth of the whole child that we strive for on a daily basis ensures that pupils leave school prepared for their next steps in education or training and equipped to go on and achieve their full potential in life. With that in mind, Year 9 had an apprenticeship talk on Wednesday morning this week, whilst Year 11 pupils were involved in Runshaw College interviews on Thursday and Friday. There is some additional end of year information to share with Year 11 parents and carers, so please look out for a letter from Mr Chadwick today, giving details of events for pupils' final few months in school.

Something that has impressed me since starting at St Michael's is the tempting array of food on offer in the canteen. It is wonderful to see so many pupils taking advantage of the lunches available, but please can I ask that parents and carers ensure lunch accounts are topped up regularly, so that children are able to purchase their food without going into a negative balance. A reminder too, that pupils are limited to a spend of £5.00 per day.

Improving communication and further developing links with the local community is something that I am so very keen to do, and I am sure you will agree that it is so important that we all work together. Unfortunately, I do need to address the fact that parking at the end of the day to pick up children is causing some issues for our neighbours and is, in some cases, posing a real safety risk. It has been brought to my attention that some cars are blocking residents' driveways or preventing pavement access for mobility scooters by parking on the kerb. Please can I ask that we are mindful of others when choosing where to wait. Leaving engines running is also very unhelpful, not least because of the environmental impact and noise pollution that it causes.

We had Consultation Evening for Year 9 parents and carers yesterday and this time we were online. If you haven't completed the questionnaire via the link that was shared, we would really appreciate your feedback. We are considering the best way to run these evenings going forward, so understanding what your thoughts are is extremely useful.

I'll finish this week's letter with the school prayer:
