Message from the Headteacher

Year 11 GCSEs 2022

The majority of Year 11 have been working diligently during their mock examination period. We have been impressed by their maturity and determination to succeed and hope they take some time to relax and recharge their batteries over the Christmas period! We are holding an Information evening for Year 11 parents on Thursday 13 January at 6.30 pm. (It will be confirmed nearer the time whether this will be held remotely or in school.) The purpose of the evening is to share with parents the contingency plans that schools have been asked to put in place in relation to GCSEs in 2022. We would urge all parents/ carers to attend this evening so that you are fully informed about the assessment process and the implications for your son/ daughter. Further details will follow in the new year. A letter from Ofqual about this can be found <u>here</u>.

Communication

Thank you to parents/ carers for your continued support for all that we strive to achieve for your sons/ daughters. As we regularly state, so much more is accomplished when we work in partnership together and pupils hear a consistent message about our expectations from home as well as from school.

Please may I remind you of the correct communication procedures to follow if you wish to speak to a member of staff: The tutor or appropriate subject teacher should be the first point of contact. If the issue cannot be resolved via the tutor/ subject teacher then please do contact the Pupil Manager/Curriculum Leader. There is also 'drop in clinic' on Tuesday from 3.30-5.00pm, which is currently being held via telephone, and therefore we do ask you to make an appointment via the school office.

All communication from parents with staff should be via one of the following routes:

1. Telephone the office

2. Use School Synergy- click on 'contact school' and select the appropriate option. Your query will be directed to the appropriate colleague who will respond in due course.

3. If there are any difficulties with either of these methods then the back -up option is to email admin@saint-michaels.lancs.sch.uk

4. It is only in exceptional circumstances, due to the specific needs of individual children who may be on support plans etc. that staff will communicate with parents directly by their school email.

A small number of parents / carers are currently emailing staff directly, often out of school hours, and if this continues unchecked it will have a significant impact on wellbeing and pupil learning. I am sure that you understand the reasons why I have asked staff not to respond to emails from parents/ carers that are sent in the evenings, at weekends or during holidays. Thank you for your support and understanding with this matter.

Covid Testing

Thank you to all parents/ carers for your continued support in ensuring that our pupils are completing twice weekly lateral flow tests. Please can we ask you to continue with this in the new year, and also help by ensuring your child arrives to school wearing a face mask and have a spare in their bag. We believe this has had a significant impact on helping to keep pupils and staff at St Michael's safe.

Covid testing will again be taking place in school when pupils return on Tuesday 4 January. This will be completed during tutorial time, supported by staff who have received training to supervise this testing. On our website https://www.saint-michaels.com/information/covid-19-resources, you will find the latest letter to parents/ carers from Dr Sakthi Karunanithi, Director of Public Health in Lancashire. His letter gives national guidance in response to Plan B, details on vaccinations for pupils, testing and the changes to close contacts. On the website, there are also links for parents/ carers to report any positive COVID-19 results. Please may we request that if your child tests positive over the Christmas period, that this is still reported to school.

This half term has once again seen pupils and staff engaged in a wide variety of activities helping our pupils to 'grow in body, mind and spirit'. Please do follow us on Twitter to keep up to date with all that is happening in school. A snapshot of some of the highlights of the half term is attached. Our pupils continue to make the whole school community proud by being involved in many activities and events beyond the curriculum.

Two colleagues have left us this term after many years' service to St Michael's: Mrs Michele Fletcher (Teaching Assistant) and Mr Andy Palfrey (ICT Technician). We thank them for all that they have contributed to the life of our school and wish them well for the future. We are delighted to welcome our new Teaching Assistant Mrs Claire Prince to the staff of St Michael's. We currently have a temporary vacancy for the post of Examinations Officer and a Teaching Assistant and are also recruiting an ICT technician. Details are on our website.

With the weather turning colder please may I ask that, should we be forced to close school during the school day, you have made contingency plans for your child. To maintain our high standards, we regularly focus on key aspects of school life. In recent weeks we have had a drive on punctuality to school and to lessons. Thank you for your support with this. When we return in January there will be a focus on school uniform, with particular attention being paid to skirt length, make-up, jewellery and coats. Please can we ask for your full support with this matter so that staff can focus their time and energy on our core purpose of learning and teaching.
