Attendance and Punctuality

Like many schools we are working hard to ensure that attendance and punctuality levels return to their 'pre covid' levels. Please can we remind all parents/carers that pupils are expected to be seated in their tutorial rooms by 8.50am every day (not arriving at the perimeter of the school premises at this time). After Easter, pupils who are late arriving to school will be spoken to by a member of senior staff. There will be a consequence issued and the situation will be monitored closely. Should it continue we will invite parents/ carers into school to discuss the issues around this. (If it is a school bus that it is late this does not affect punctuality.) Our high expectations at St Michael's apply to all areas of school life. As a school, a key responsibility is to help prepare our young people for life beyond school. Poor punctuality is not tolerated in the workplace and is simply

not acceptable in school.

Any absence affects the pattern of a child's schooling and regular absence will seriously affect their learning.

Any pupil's absence/ late arrival also disrupts teaching routines and may affect the learning of others in the same class. I am sure that you are aware that ensuring your child's regular attendance at school is the legal responsibility of the parent/carer and permitting absence from school without a good reason creates an offence in law and may result in prosecution. Thank you to all parents/ carers for your support in helping us to make improvements in this area of school life.

I am delighted to inform you that our Data Manager/ Exams Officer, Mrs Lissie Lever, has given birth to a son William Jack. Her maternity leave is being covered by Mrs Christina Brook.
