

St Michael's Newsletter: Lent 2 Message from the Headteacher

Dear Parents / Carers

As the Lent term draws to a close and we prepare for Easter, I wish to mention a few highlights of this term and also look forward to the Trinity term.

The pupils continue to embrace the myriad of opportunities available at St Michael's. It is our hope that every young person engages with the extensive wider curriculum provision in school. If your son/ daughter does not currently attend a club or activity outside the classroom, please encourage them to do so.





We are so impressed with Year 11 and their positive attitude to learning. It was fantastic to see such high levels of attendance and support from parents/ carers at Revision Evening. There are a limited number of classes being held during the Easter holidays and if these apply to your son/ daughter you will have already received information about this. I know that our pupils, with your support, will strike the right balance between their studies and having some time for rest and enjoyment in the holiday period. We look forward to welcoming parents and carers of Year 11 to school on Friday 26 May at 11.15am for our Leavers' Service.

Uniform

Thank you to all parents/ carers who support our drive for the highest standards of uniform amongst our pupils. We continue to work hard to ensure that the length of girls' skirts is correct (within three inches of the knee). The changes to the design of the waistbands is helping to support this and we ask for parents/ carers support too. Please may we also ask parents/ carers to ensure that any treatments your child may be receiving (e.g. nails, hair, beauty) around the holiday period do not impact school in any way. Our uniform and appearance policy is applied consistently and on every day that school is open. Having to undo/ remove costly treatments and the potential tension this creates between home and school is so unnecessary and a significant waste of school resource and time that could be spent supporting learning and teaching. Please can we ask for the full support of all parents/ carers in this as we will not allow the actions of a small minority to affect the majority of our pupils who consistently show the highest standards of uniform and appearance.

Leadership Roles

We are currently in the midst of our rigorous selection process for the most senior pupil leadership roles in school, with interviews due to take place straight after the Easter break. It is a huge honour to read so many wonderful letters of application expressing what St Michael's means to our pupils.

Charitable Giving

In encouraging all our pupils to be courageous advocates we are uplifted by the response to our Zambia 2024 Appeal. Thank you so much for all your donations of clothes and school equipment. Mrs Hooley and Miss Forrest visited Zambia at half term to look at the projects that St Michael's will be supporting. This fundraising has been the focus of our Lent Appeal this term and we look forward to the Dance Showcase tomorrow evening, again in aid of the Zambia project.

Attendance and Punctuality

Thank you to parents/ carers for your support in helping us to improve attendance and punctuality. As previously mentioned in newsletters, attendance really does matter and there is a clear correlation between time spent in school and attainment. Similarly punctuality and attending school on time encourages young people to form good habits for later life. Attendance and punctuality form part of references passed onto employers and colleges.

Outdoor Worship Space

We were delighted to welcome Bishop Philip North to school last week to lead a Eucharist service and bless our outdoor worship space. This has been a long-standing pupil project, delayed by the pandemic, but originally designed by former pupils Morgan Kinloch and Kate Hiller. Current Year 11 pupils have focused on 'Showing Stewardship' as part of their school improvement planning and through consultation with the School Council, members of each tutorial have planted bulbs. It is hoped that as well as being used for worship that this space will also be an area where pupils can enjoy the opportunity for quiet reflection. This project really highlights what can be achieved through pupils working together and sharing their ideas. We are grateful to Armlee Nurseries for their generous donation of plants.

Archbishop's Young Leaders Award

Bishop Philip was also able to present the Archbishop's Young Leaders Award to our young people now in Year 9 for their exceptional contribution to the community. It was a joy to welcome parents into school for this special ceremony.

A visit from Bishop Joseph Aba

Following the visit of Bishop Philip, we were delighted to welcome Bishop Joseph Aba from South Sudan to school. Bishop Joseph was visiting school as part of a week-long event organised by Blackburn Diocese. This inspirational Christian leader toured school with pupils, spoke to pupils in RE lessons and met our pupil Courageous Advocacy representatives.

Staffing

We have said farewell to our Pastoral Support officer Mrs Whiteley this half term and wish her well in her new role. Best wishes to Mrs Brunsden who commences her maternity leave next term. We are delighted to welcome Ms Tait back to St Michael's to cover this period in PE.

Duke of Edinburgh's Award

We are looking forward to the first 'off-site' Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award expedition in Year 9 in July. Since starting the Curriculum Enrichment programme in 2019 there have been more than 600 pupils achieving this valuable, accredited Award but the pandemic has prevented us from holding the expedition as we planned.

Congratulations and thank you to the 11 members of staff who volunteered to complete training and have passed their Lowland Leader qualifications to facilitate this award. We are excited at the prospect of our first 'real' camping experience with our young people. We hope all who have registered for the Award will take part, learn new skills, practise resilience, embrace the challenges this will bring and have fun!

Work Experience

Year 10 pupils are presently approaching employers for work experience placements ready for our first reinstated 'Work Experience Week' in July. Continual Professional Development

We are delighted to have been approached by the Church of England to run a programme of training within school which will lead to National Professional Qualifications for staff.
