Uniform

Thank you for your continued support in helping to meet our high expectations and standards of uniform. If you are intending to purchase new items of uniform in the summer please can I remind you of the importance of labelling all individual items. Our full uniform and appearance regulations are in the personal organiser as well as on the school website. Please may we ask for your continued support in helping to ensure that the following aspects of our dress code, are adhered to at all times:

Shoes: Black traditional style. No trainer style or canvas allowed. See images on the website if unsure.

Hair: This must be of a naturally occurring shade. **No shaven heads (no shorter** than a number 2 sides and back). No lines cut into the hair or extreme fashion styles. Plain hair bands/slides-black only.

Ties: Clip on ties only (which should be free from graffiti/ pen marks)
Skirts should be no more than three inches from the knee and waist bands should not be rolled over.

Failure to follow the uniform and appearance policy will result in working in isolation from the rest of the class. School will be the final arbiter of uniform related

Thank you for your support in helping to avoid taking your children out of school in term time. Please may I remind parents and carers that any requests for absence may only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. Attendance at school is one of the biggest influences on success. We would ask all parents to support us by ensuring that your son/daughter attends school regularly. Like all schools we are working hard to help ensure that our attendance figures return to the high levels that they were prior to the pandemic. We would ask for your full support in this matter.

Building projects

We continue to work on upgrading our facilities. We are hoping that later next year that work will begin on refurbishing the school hall, a project that has only been made possible through the support of St Michael's Trust. Thank you to the large numbers of parents/ carers who contribute to this. It is not surprising in the current economic climate that contributions have declined. 
Readathon

Archery St Michael's pupils have become some of the first in the UK to have archery in their PE lessons!


Careers opportunities

The couple, who met at St Michael's, have both dedicated their entire teaching careers to the school, starting as newly qualified teachers and taking on new responsibilities over the years.

They have been inspirational members of the teaching staff, familiar faces to literally thousands of pupils and instrumental in leading an array of wider curricular activities, the German exchange and school productions to

name but two.

We are also saying a fond farewell to Mrs Dawn Hull who has worked as our school librarian for the past 15 years. The dedication and commitment of these members of staff is unprecedented and all will be incredibly missed.

Mrs Cunningham

Having given 41 years of dedicated service to the pupils of St Michael's, Mrs Janet Cunningham is taking her retirement this summer.

Beginning her career as Miss Singleton, she has inspired generations of pupils, nurturing in them a love of both music and the arts but also sharing her passion for the outdoors, over the years. She has taught under all St Michael's headteachers and was instrumental in school being awarded with Performing Arts College status in recognition of the outreach work done in the community. This led to both an extension of the performing arts facilities, the creation of the dance and drama studios and recruitment of

new arts staff.

Mrs Cunningham, who also started the Chapel Choir, has been involved in 20 school musical productions and remembers each one fondly, recalling all pupils who appeared in each.

But this dedicated teacher of Music and the Performing Arts is also remembered by many pupils for her love of the outdoors, and along with Mr David Watson, leading the outdoor pursuits option at school.

Twice a week she could be found involved in activities including orienteering, canoeing or climbing and has also led visits backpacking in Scotland, exploring Iceland and she has taken music groups to Sweden and Salzburg.

It is also for her involvement in visits to Malham that she is fondly remembered by many, where '3rd year' pupils spent the week climbing Pen-y-Ghent, enjoying Malham Cove and abseiling, an activity she led four times a year!

'I worked it out that I've spent a year of my life sleeping in the same bed in the Malham youth hostel,' she said. Janet is also particularly valued for her commitment to staff who are early in their careers, assisting both with trainees and early career teachers, as well as offering her extensive expertise through coaching.

I love seeing new staff coming into their careers and celebrating the progress they make,' she said.

Mr Ian Cunningham has been at St Michael's for 36 years, also starting as a newly qualified teacher. For the majority of his time here, he has been a dedicated member of the languages department, teaching mostly German with just a little French and Maths over the years.

He has played a major role in the continuation of the exchange links with Villingen Schwenningen and has taken many hundreds of pupils to this beautiful part of the world, encouraging them to be inspired by a love of both the German language and culture. Janet and Ian remain firm friends with their German exchange colleague Volker Becker and visiting him in Germany is an activity that the Cunninghams have already planned for the Autumn.

Mr Cunningham took over from Mrs Julie Heaton as Head of Fry house, before becoming Head of Year / Pupil Manager, predominantly for Year 8.

His calm nature and gentle manner with the pupils made him the perfect candidate for the position of Special Educational Needs Coordinator, a role he took on in 2015, leading a dedicated team of Teaching Assistants.

And what will they miss about St Michael's?

'We will miss the constant interaction with people, staff and pupils,' said Janet. 'The challenge of co-ordinating creativity and seeing ideas evolve and coming to fruition in our arts events, school celebration and acts of worship. Experiencing the very best of humanity day in day out.

'St Michael's is a very big part of both our lives,' Ian said. 'The staff are not just colleagues but also friends.'

The Cunninghams are looking forward to spending more time with their daughter Helen and her husband Mike, travelling and going cycling, a pastime they both adore.

Everyone at Team St Michael's wishes them best wishes in their retirement.
