Pupil Outcomes

We are absolutely delighted that once again our excellent pupil outcomes have been recognised by SSAT (The Schools, Students and Teachers Network) in this year's Educational Outcomes Awards. The award recognises that St Michael's is among the highest performing secondary schools in the country, based on 2023 performance data and information from Ofsted.

St Michael's was recognised in two categories, receiving awards for being in the top 20% of schools nationally for pupil progress and in the top 10% of non-selective schools for pupil attainment in the 2023 end of KS4 exams.

The SSAT Educational Outcomes database compares all state-funded schools in England. To be recognised with an Educational Outcomes Award is a significant achievement and a testament to the work of the whole school community.
