#### END of YEAR RESULTS - TIME TO CELEBRATE!!

Not only have we just had a successful Ofsted but we are super proud of our end of year academic results too. Staff and children have worked really hard to ensure that the impact of the pandemic had been addressed.

This year in the phonics screening test 100% of pupils passed, in 2019 the national average was 82%. We've also achieved end of KS1 and KS2 results to be really proud of, all of which have exceeded the last set of national test averages from 2019.

65% of KS2 (Year 6) children nationally in 2019 achieved the expected standard in reading, writing and maths – this year we achieved 85% with 31% achieving a greater depth in writing (the national average in 2019 was 20%).

In KS1 (year 2) in 2019 the national averages were 75% for reading, 69% for writing and 76% for maths. For us this year our results are 90% for reading, 80% for writing and 90% for maths.

We have a huge amount to be proud of – first and foremost that our children are confident, happy and well-rounded children and with academic results which show our children leave Samlesbury with the very best education.

We hope that you will be as delighted as we are as we continue to build on the successes of this year.
