LOCAL REFERENDUM ON THE PPROPOSED CUERDALE GARDEN VILLAGE PLANNING APPLICATION

I'm sure for those of you who live in the local area you will be aware of the application for a huge housing development just down the road towards the motorway.

There is a local action group which has been formed to respond to this and they have organised for an official local referendum to be carried out which is for anyone who is on the electoral role of Samlesbury & Cuerdale. The group have asked for the following information to be shared in our school newsletter so that as many as people as possible have the chance for their voice to be heard. The referendum takes place at the Samlesbury Memorial Hall between 4pm and 9pm on Thursday 7th of April. The question being asked is very simple **"Do you oppose the Story Homes/Cuerdale Garden Village Development?"** If they oppose the development, they should answer "YES",

For the referendum to have an impact there needs to be 75% of respondents to say "YES". The referendum is based on the number of people who vote and not the number on the Electoral Role, so if only 50% of people vote it still has impact, but the more people who vote the more meaningful it will be. It does appear to be that people have to go in person to vote; there will be no postal vote or votes by proxy.
