
WORLD BOOK DAY NEXT WEEK



COVID UPDATE



Following the Prime Ministers announcement on Monday evening, from Thursday 24 February, the Government have removed the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. However, the advice from the government is that adults and children who test positive should still stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days, and only return to work/school

when they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days.

We are waiting for further guidance from the Director of Public Health for Lancashire to inform schools of best practice going forward but in the meantime we ask that the school community follows the advice from the government and supports school in keeping everyone well.

MMR PUBLIC HEALTH INFORMATION FOR RECEPTION CLASS PARENTS/CARERS



Parents and guardians of children aged 1 to 5 years are encouraged to check that they are up to date with their MMR vaccines. One in 10 children under the age of 5 in England haven't had one or both of their MMR vaccines. This leaves these children unprotected and increases the risk of outbreaks occurring in schools and nurseries. The MMR vaccine is the safest and most effective way for parents and guardians to protect their children against measles, mumps, and rubella. Previous doses can be

checked in your child's red book. Parents or guardians of children who are not up to date with their two doses of MMR vaccine should contact their GP practice to book an appointment. It's never too late to catch up.
