

FRIDAY UPDATE - 12th March 2021

It's been fantastic to have all the children back in school! We've spent this week settling everyone back into school; spending time reflecting on what has happened over the last three months; the routines in school we need to continue with and importantly, what we are looking forward to in the future!

We are continuing with our full curriculum but with a focus on reading, writing and maths as we begin the process of 'catching up' lost learning. You may hear on the media that 'catch up' can happen relatively quickly; in reality this process will take much longer than a term as we want to make sure our children retain and internalise any learning which needs reinforcing; this certainly can't be rushed through in a term. Our children's wellbeing is an equal priority with ensuring academic gaps are closed. At parents evening, your child's class teacher will discuss with you next steps if any additional support is needed. In the meantime if you do any questions or queries please do get in contact with your child's teacher.

COVID UPDATE

As before lock down, if your child displays any of the symptoms of Covid, please so not send them into school but immediately book a PCR test. Please inform school of this and the result before they return to school. As in the autumn term, work will be sent home for any child who has to self isolate or is waiting for a test result. An independent study pack will be sent home on the first day (Sandra will email this to you) and work for following days will be sent via your child's class teacher.

We did so well in the autumn term and didn't have to shut any of our class bubbles so please do keep following all government guidelines on social distancing until we are fully through all the restrictions. Thank you.
